It doesn't explain any more than 1 % unique variance above and beyond PRS in predicting G1 PRS.

Yaacov and I just realized why there's a 0 correlation between PRS and passage placement at AP3 in K. It's because the LC passage is fixed. About 90% of K students are taking the fixed LC passage and the remaining 10% are being placed in a G1 passage for reading comprehension. It's a little strange that a high percentage of K students are scoring in the green (Mean PRS==83; median = 91); yet their teachers are electing to give them the fixed LC passage. We need to change the report to reflect our sudden understanding of the 0 correlation.

When do you need the final report? Yaacov can dig further into the K LC vs. RC situation.
